

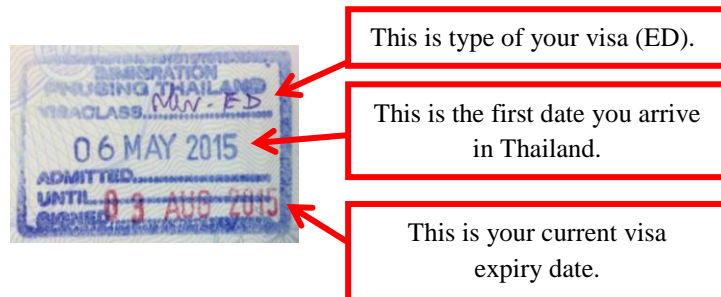
1. About Non-ED visa



This visa is issued to applicants who enter Thailand for the purpose of education (ED). It is valid for **90 days** counting from the first date you enter Thailand. Then, you can extend the visa for one year until you finish the study.

Note:

- ❖ The date of the “**Enter Before**” on your Non-ED visa is the date that you should enter Thailand before. After you enter Thailand, this is **NOT** your current visa expiry date.
- ❖ The current visa expiry date can be found from the stamp by the Immigration on the first date that you arrive in Thailand.



2. Extension of Non-ED visa

You **MUST** contact IRD, KKU **AT LEAST ONE MONTH** before your current visa expires. It usually takes a week for IRD to prepare the documents and issue you the visa extension letter which has to be submitted to Khon Kaen immigration (KK immigration) afterwards.

Documents required for IRD:

1. Visa Extension Request Form IR 4 (visit ird.kku.ac.th or iris.kku.ac.th)
2. A copy of passport
 - a. Front page with personal data
 - b. Page of Non-ED visa
 - c. Page of the current visa expiry date
3. A copy of student ID card
4. A copy of transcript/ grade results

Documents required for KK immigration:

1. Visa extension letter from IRD, KKU
2. TM.7 form (available at the immigration)
3. Original passport and a copy
4. Original student ID card and a copy
5. One photograph
6. Fee of 1,900 Baht

Note:

- ❖ The visa extension request can be applied 30 days prior to the current visa expiry date.
- ❖ The fine for an overstay is 500 Baht per day or a maximum of up to 20,000 Baht.



3. 90-day report

NOTICE

TO NOTIFY OF STAYING LONGER THAN 90 DAYS
The Alien permitted to stay longer in the kingdom must notify your place of residence to the immigration office every 90 days.

In case of application for extension of temporary stay in the kingdom by TM.7 you have notified your place of residence at the first time.

Any Alien who fails to comply with will be punished with a fine not exceeding 5,000.-Baht and with an Additional fine not exceeding 200.-Baht for each day which passes until the law is complied with.

All foreigners who have been granted a Non-Immigration Visa for a temporary stay in Thailand and intend to stay longer than 90 days must report every 90 days at KK immigration.

Required documents to make the notification in person:

1. Original passport
2. TM.47 form (available at the immigration)
3. A receipt of the 90-day notification (if any)

Note:

- ❖ You can make the notification directly in person at Khon Kaen Immigration.
- ❖ The notification must be made within 15 days before or 7 days after the period of 90 days expires.

- ❖ The notification of staying in the Kingdom over 90 days is not equivalent to a visa extension.
- ❖ If a foreigner stays in the kingdom over 90 days without notifying the Immigration Bureau or notifying the Immigration Bureau later than the set period, a fine of 2,000 Baht will be collected. If a foreigner who does not make the notification of staying over 90 days is arrested, he will be fined 4,000 Baht.
- ❖ If a foreigner leaves the country and re-enters, the day count starts at 1 in every case.

4. Re-entry permit

If you have to leave Thailand with the intention of returning, you must apply for a re-entry permit. Otherwise your current visa will expire immediately.



Documents required:

1. Original passport
2. TM.8 form (available at the immigration)
3. One photograph
4. Fee of 1,000 Baht for single entry or 3,800 Baht for multiple entry within the period of your current visa.

Note:

- ❖ You can apply for re-entry permit one month in advance at any immigration in Thailand.

5. Lost passport

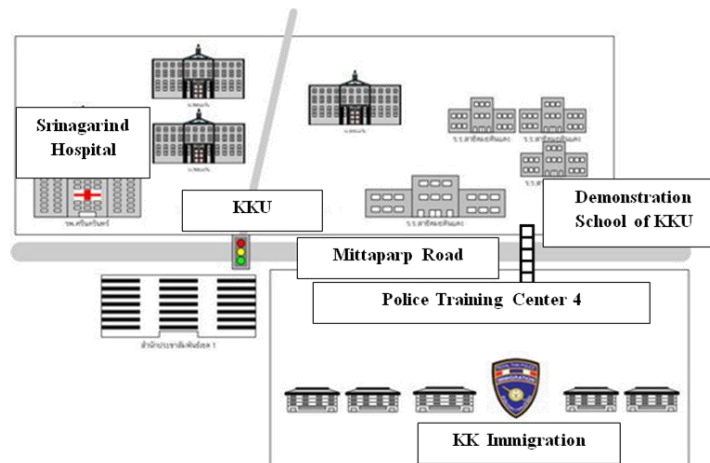
1. Report the lost passport at the police station nearby.
2. Bring the police report to your embassy or consulate. If there is no embassy in Thailand, contact the Department of Consular Affairs or the Foreign Ministry.
3. Bring the new passport and letter from the embassy or consulate to KK immigration to request a copy of visa stamp input into the new passport.
